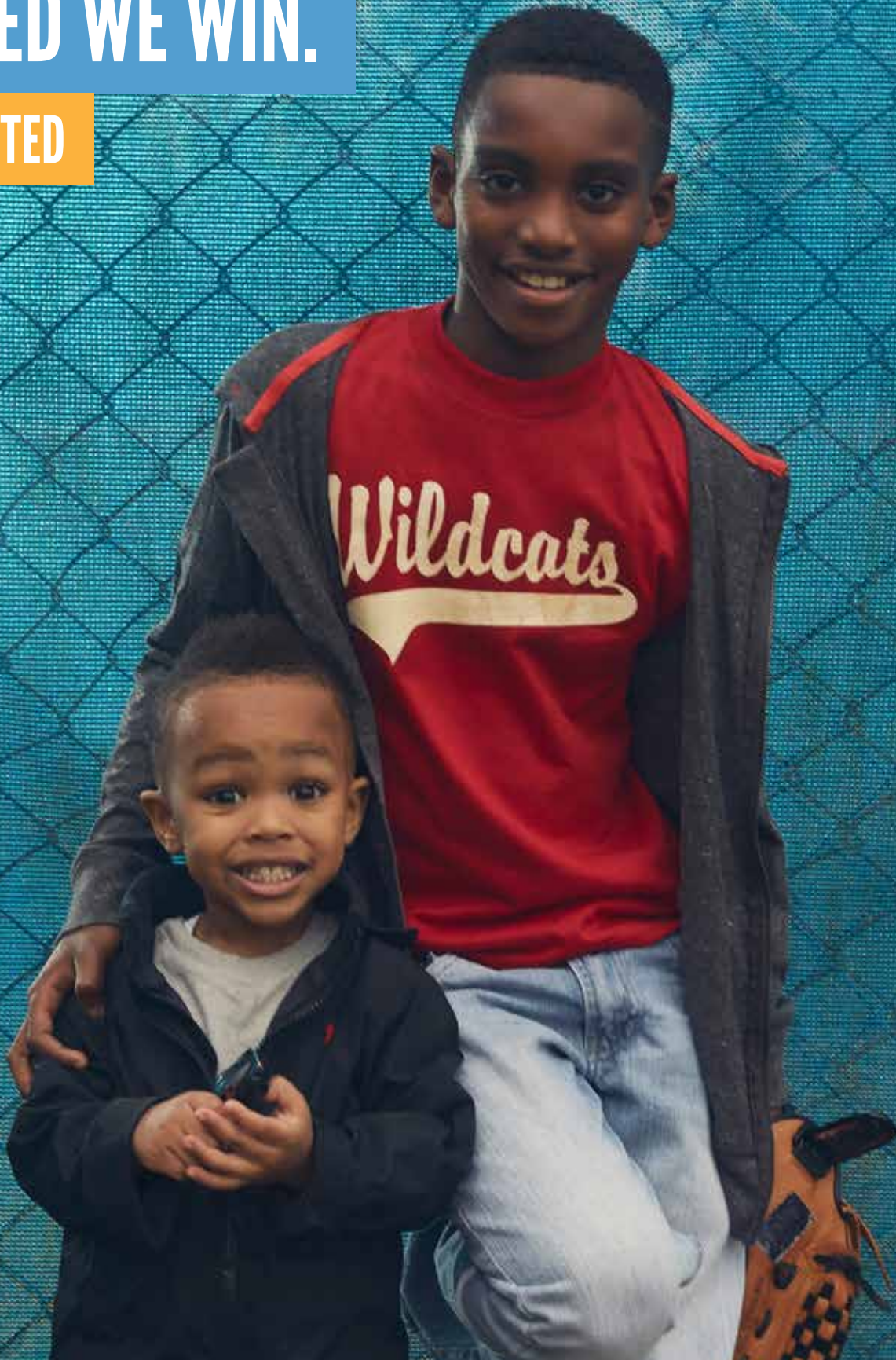

ACHIEVE ESCAMBIA

Achieve Escambia is a cradle to career collective impact initiative of more than 150 individuals representing 50 partner organizations across Escambia County.

Members of the Achieve Escambia partnership commit to working better together to improve education outcomes affecting children, youth, and young adults on their journey to employment. Achieve Escambia currently has two Collective Action Networks working to improve kindergarten readiness and career readiness. Using a structured form of collaboration, a focus on shared data, and continuous improvement tools, Achieve Escambia partners engage in strategies that yield program and service efficiencies and create innovative ways of working together to achieve more equitable results for learners of all ages and backgrounds.

COMMUNITY DRIVES

United Way assists with Communities Caring at Christmas and Christmas Wishes. Individuals and business partners collect money and gifts to help parents and foster families provide a joyful holiday for vulnerable children and adults with developmental disabilities. Their efforts generated nearly \$100,000 that served 278 families.

COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

In 2018, 55 volunteers donated nearly 1,300 hours of their time to review programs, conduct site visits, and listen to agency program presentations. 42 programs were funded for a total of \$850,000 in grants.

CRAM THE VAN

Cram the Van, Escambia County School District's only approved supply drive, ensures students have the supplies they need to succeed.

In 2017, our generous community distributed \$42,000 in supplies to 68 area schools, helping over 7,400 students in need. More than 40 local businesses held collection drives or donated supplies, and 204 volunteers collectively donated 455 hours of their time to sort, count, and distribute school supplies. Through Cram the Van, our community made a \$78,000 impact on our schools.

DAY OF CARING

In 2017, more than 1,300 volunteers rolled up their sleeves across our community to spend time with seniors, read to students, paint, build, refurbish, landscape, and so much more. Together, Day of Caring volunteers completed 97 service projects at 68 local nonprofit agencies and schools and donated 4,463 hours of their time for an estimated \$107,748 of in-kind labor.



EDUCATION SUMMIT

The Education Summit, hosted at Pensacola State College and sponsored by Gulf Power Company, Baptist Health Care, AT&T, Buffalo Rock, and the Escambia County School District, connected School District social workers and guidance counselors with services that support children in our schools.

In 2017, the Education Summit was attended by 46 school district employees and 21 nonprofit agency representatives.

FAMILYWISE

FamilyWize is a longtime partner, working with nearly 1,000 United Ways dedicated to helping improve the health and well-being of individuals, families, and communities. In 2017-18, this program helped local citizens save over \$307,675 on prescription medication.

FREE TAX ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and MyFreeTaxes.com (MFT) programs provide hard-working families with free tax filing options, both online and in-person.

In 2018, the program generated 4,062 tax returns and saved taxpayers \$792,213 in tax preparation fees. IRS Certified Volunteers served a combined 5,020 hours, equaling \$121,182 in

volunteer labor. United Way is home to one of three nationwide MFT Call Centers. Escambia County's call center assisted over 2,388 taxpayers with a variety of tax-related issues. United Way tax assistance programs leveraged a community impact of over \$6 million.

READINGPALS

During the 2017-18 school year, 245 volunteers served a total of 3,736 hours. ReadingPals, in partnership with ECARE, had a \$90,187 impact on our community.

RETIRED SENIOR VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

The Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) is sponsored by the Corporation for National and Community Service. Through this program, individuals aged 55 and better are able to offer their time and talents to meet the community's needs. In 2017-18, 189 volunteers served 10,200 hours at 20 sites, valued at \$251,825.

VISTA ALIGNS

In 2017-18, 17 VISTAs served 18,424 hours with nine local nonprofit agencies: Achieve Escambia, Boys and Girls Clubs of the Emerald Coast, Chain Reaction, Every Child A Reader in Escambia (ECARE), First City Arts Center, Gulf Coast Kid's House, Legal Services of North Florida, Manna Food Pantries, and United Way of Escambia County.

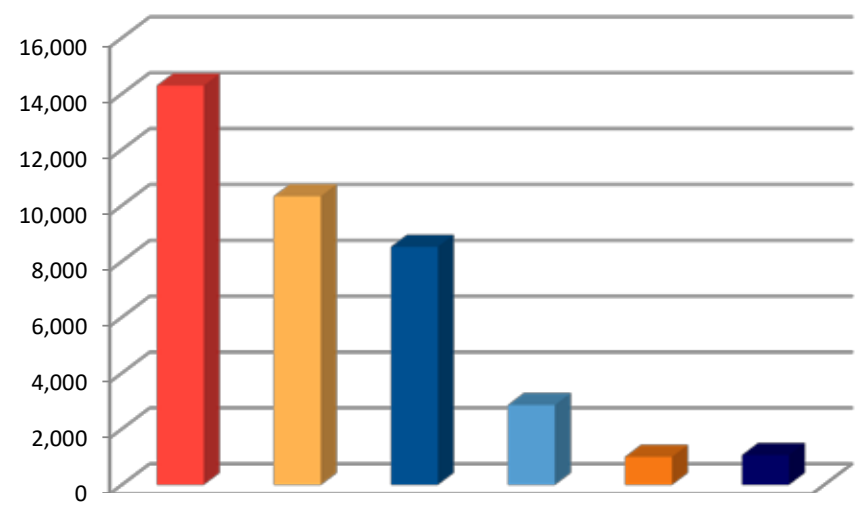

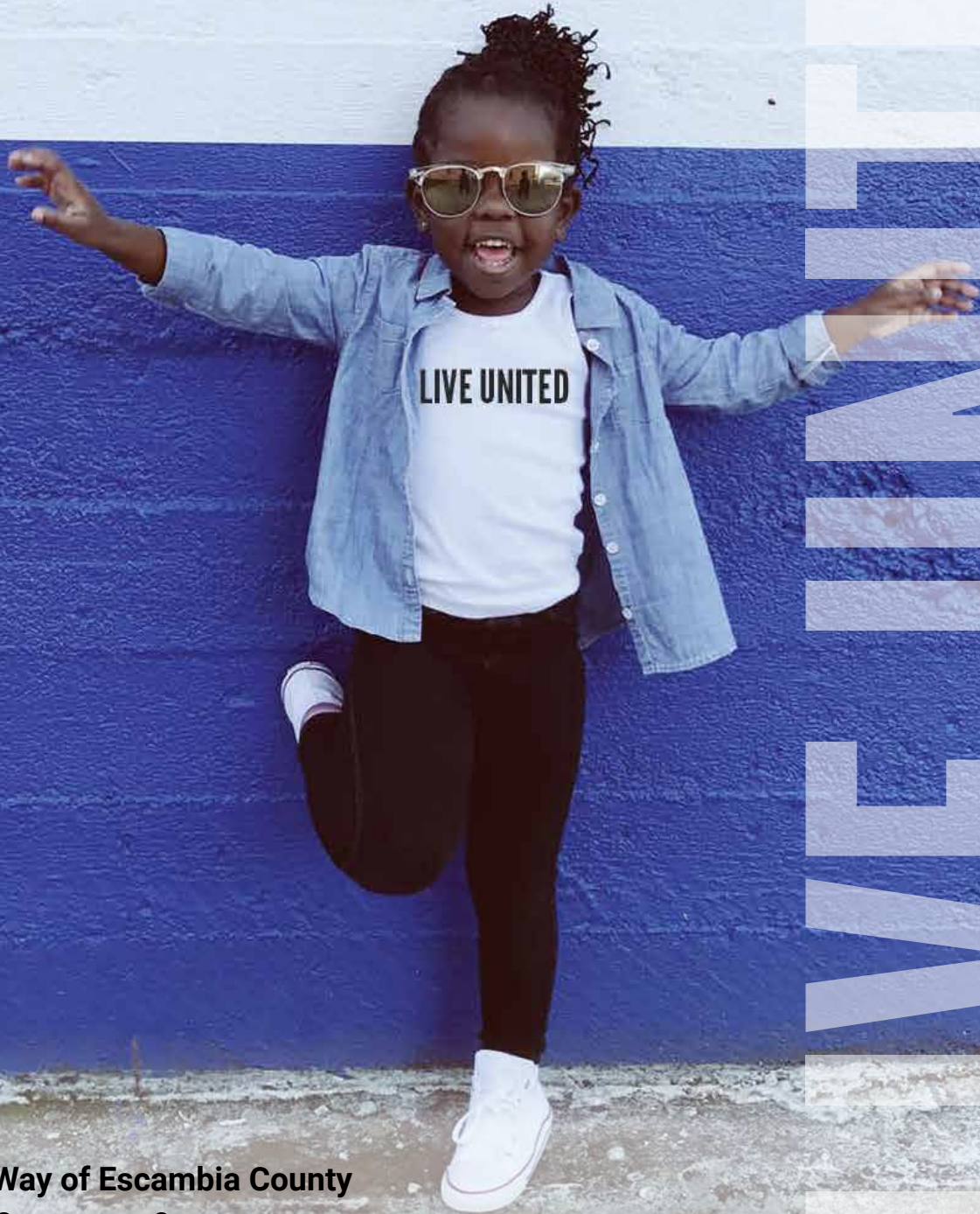
