

# Escambia County, Florida • ALICE State and County Household Budgets 2022

Traditional economic measures underestimate the actual cost of basics. To better capture the reality of household costs in each Florida county, United For ALICE provides budgets that are tailored by location and household type.

These budgets include **housing, child care, food, transportation, health care, and technology, plus taxes** and a 10% **miscellaneous** category.

## The ALICE Household Survival Budget

The Household Survival Budget reflects the minimum cost to live and work in the current economy. This budget is the basis for determining whether households are above or below the ALICE Threshold by region.

In 2022, household costs in every county in Florida were well above the Federal Poverty Level of \$13,590 for a single adult and \$27,750 for a family of four.
